



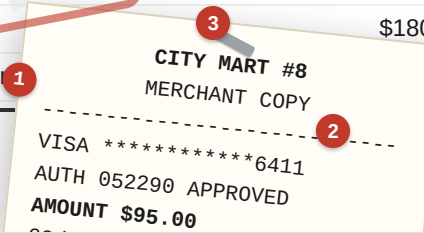

This document will be denied — send something else.

WHY THIS FAILS

- 1 The credit-card receipt is stapled on top of the statement, covering the exam, frames, and lens lines and their charges underneath** — a reviewer can't tell it's prescription eyewear or what it cost.
- 2 It also hides the patient-responsibility total**, so more than one required element is unreadable in this image.
- 3 The statement underneath is probably perfect** — the problem is placement. A **covered** element counts exactly the same as a missing one, and the claim gets denied for illegibility.

✓ WHAT TO SEND INSTEAD

Don't attach the receipt over the statement. Submit them as **two separate pages or photos**, or lay the small receipt in a **blank margin** so nothing overlaps. Scan or photograph flat so every line — date, item, provider, patient, and amount — is fully visible. The receipt is fine as proof of payment; it just can't sit on top of the details.

SAMPLE — synthetic teaching exhibit; fictitious provider, patient & data. **Not a real record.**
